.....Recommendations



The Scottish Government implements a Race Equality Framework with a wider participation approach to ensure all groups are reflected and represented in the development of national and local laws, policies and programmes.



The Scottish Government adopts a wide-ranging implementation plan, consistent with international human rights standards, to reconcile the human rights of Gypsies and Travellers and settled communities.



The Scottish Government introduces integration legislation that sets out refugees' rights to access and enjoy the full benefit of Scottish public services. A bill would also act as a safeguard against the impact of further reductions in rights instigated by UK legislation.



Questions for the Government

What steps has the Scottish Government taken to ensure that 'invisible minorities' and those facing multiple layers of discrimination are better reflected in its 'Race Equality Framework'?

What actions has the Scottish Government taken to address discrimination against Gypsies and Travellers, and to improve their health, education and employment outcomes? What has the Scottish Government done to improve conditions on halting sites for Gypsies and Travellers in Scotland?

What actions has the Scottish Government taken to improve the provision of public services for asylum seekers and refugees?
